#### Dear Parent/Guardian:

Our school, students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, agree that this compact outlines how the parents, the entire school staff, and the students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement as well as describes how the school and parents will build and develop a partnership that will help children achieve Georgia's high standards.

This compact is the product of a collaborative effort among our school staff, our parents, and our community. Parents are invited to attend and participate with the school improvement planning process, from which areas of need are identified and goals are developed. This process begins in the spring at the end of one school year and extends into the summer prior to the start of the new school year. The School-Parent Compact is presented at these meetings where the input of school staff, parents, and community members is encouraged for the purpose of revising the compact. Further consideration for the purpose of compact revisions comes from the input of students through satisfaction surveys. Parents are also encouraged to participate in the annual Title I parent survey that is also used as a tool to collect parent feedback regarding the current Title I programs and policies.

To understand how working together can benefit your child, it is first important to understand the district's and school's goals for student academic achievement.

### GAINESVILLE CITY SCHOOLS DISTRICT STRATEGIC PLAN

The GCSS Strategic Plan is a 5-year plan for 2019-2024. It has four main goals that are related to the pillars of the district mission, which are to inspire, nurture, challenge, and prepare students. The Strategic Plan includes 12 measures (3 for each goal) to help determine the achievement of the goals. The four goals of the Strategic Plan are:

- Goal 1: Every student will be supported and encouraged within a safe learning environment.
- Goal 2: Every student will receive the necessary wraparound support to be successful.
- Goal 3: Every student will progress at a pace to meet his/her academic potential.
- Goal 4: Every student will graduate with skills and experiences necessary to compete globally, think critically, and communicate effectively.

#### **ENOTA GOALS**

To support the district's goals listed above, the Enota School Improvement Plan for 2019-2020 has four goal areas: literacy, math, science, and behavioral/socioemotional supports. Below are the general goals from the Enota School Improvement Plan that relate to these goal areas.

- Goal 1: The 2021-2022 EOY percentage of students at each grade level performing below benchmark (DIBELS), well below benchmark (DIBELS), or below basic (RI) will decrease by 10% compared to the same cohort from the previous year's MOY administration of the district reading screener.
- Goal 2: The Milestones Writing Assessment awards points in three categories: Idea Development, Language Usage & Conventions, and Narrative Writing Response. A maximum of 11 points may be earned for these three categories combined. The percentage of students scoring below a 3 on each schoolwide writing assessment will be 5% less than the percentage of students who on the Milestones for 2020-2021 earned less than 5 of the 11 possible points.
- Goal 3: The 2021-2022 EOY percentage of students at each grade level in tier 3 on the district math screener will decrease by 5% compared to the same cohort from the previous year's EOY administration of the district math screener.
- Goal 4: The percent of fifth grade students not passing the Milestones science test will be reduced by 5% compared to the 2020-2021 fifth grade class.
- Goal 5: 70% of students in grades K-5 will master at a 70% level the grade level essential science vocabulary for each quarter.
- Goal 6: The number of office referrals for each grade level will be reduced by 5% compared to the same cohort from the previous year's EOY office referrals.
- Goal 7: We will maintain our PBIS Tier 1 implementation and achieve the requirements for PBIS Tier 2 implementation.

To help your child meet the district and school goals, the school, you, and your child will work together to fulfill the responsibilities described below.

#### SCHOOL/TEACHER RESPONSIBILITIES

Our school will:

- Provide high quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the
  participating children to meet the state's student academic achievement standards by doing the following:
  - o Teachers will work as a team with all students and their families to support students' achievement in all subject areas.
  - o A student planner or agenda will be used daily to help facilitate communication with home.
  - We will provide math and reading resources for parents to work at home with their children.
  - o We will offer information and instruction for parents to help them with their students' reading and math.
  - Teachers will provide vocabulary expansion exercises for students to practice at home that will be in alignment with our balanced literacy model.
  - o Teachers will offer suggestions for types of nonfiction materials for students to read at home with parents.
  - o Our school webpage has family friendly academic links to build both math and vocabulary materials.

- Accommodate the need for parent-teacher conferences with a flexible schedule for all parents to have the opportunity to meet with their children's teachers and to check their children's progress in school.
- Provide Parents with:
  - o A progress report half way through each quarter's 9-week grading period.
  - o A report card at the end of each 9-week grading period.
  - Weekly updates through weekly take-home folders and/or digital communication.
- Provide parents with reasonable access to administrators, faculty, and staff.
  - The school's front office will be open from 8 am-4pm Monday-Friday.
  - Bilingual staff will be available to interpret when needed.
  - o Parents can send a note in the agenda or call in advance to make an appointment for a conference.
- Provide a variety of opportunities for parents to be involved in their children's education including:
  - o Parents may join the Parent-Teacher-Association (PTA), and are included on the School Governance Council.
  - o Parents may become trained to serve as mentors through Center Point Agency.
  - o Parents, businesses, and community organizations may become partners in education.
  - o Parents may make appointments to take a tour of our school throughout the school year.
  - o See the Parent Involvement Plan for additional opportunities for parents to be involved at school.

## PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES

#### We, as parents, will:

- 1. Partner with teachers and staff to discuss ideas about how we can support our student's math and reading achievement.
- 2. Review our student's planner or agenda daily for instruction and behavior notes and/or respond to digital communication.
- 3. Except for reasons that are excused, make sure our child is at school on time and ready to learn every school day. Students must be in the classroom by 7:40 each morning.
- 4. Use math and reading resources, manipulative kits and online sites, to support learning at home.
- 5. Try to attend family and parent events or get information from the Parent Center, PTA, or my child's teacher.
- 6. Play word games with my child or actively use my child's new vocabulary words with him/her on a daily basis.
- 7. Look through the take-home folder each week, monitor my child's work, and go over my child's work with my child.
- 8. Read with or to my child for at least 10 minutes every day.
- 9. Practice appropriate math facts with my child every day.

#### STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

#### As a student, I commit that I will:

- 1. Practice solving math problems, applying strategies and concepts presented in class.
- Practice strategies presented in class to strengthen reading fluency and reading comprehension skills.
- 3. Practice strategies presented in class to strengthen the development of ideas and writing skills.
- 4. Review my agenda with my parents daily for instruction and behavior notes.
- 5. Talk with my parents about new sight words or vocabulary words and what I am learning in math.
- 6. Bring home folder with my work and information for my parents.
- 7. Keep a reading log signed by my parents after we read every day for at least 10 minutes.
- 8. Be attentive in class and complete all assignments given by my teachers.
- 9. Self-monitor my progress in attendance, behavior, and classroom achievement, as directed by my teacher.
